Feedback included: <ul> <li>Concerns that the time difference would result in swimming in WA becoming more isolated and operationally more difficult;</li> <li>Concerns that money from State sponsors would no longer be available, resulting in a smaller pool of funds nationally; and</li> <li>Concerns that resources would not be shared fairly amongst the states with an east-coast-centric management.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

	result, swimmers exit the sport usually before the age of 12. SWA has advocated that eight year olds be able to compete in Club and Inter	
	reach their teenage years nationally. SAL has referred to research indicating 'burn out' is all too common right across all Australian Clubs. Getting children involved in full competition from seven and eight years of age, applies significant physical and mental stress to our youngsters at an impressionable age. The	



knowledge and experience needed to run the Carnivals.

The Squads are entry-level squad programmes run by Swimming WA Clubs. Guidelines as to the expectations of squads utilising the Junior Dolphins branding will be released in due course.

### SunSmart Splash & Dash:

This programme will remain fundamentally the same to previous years. Notable changes include changes to entry prices (including the introduction of a separate Public price) and the option to integrate the Splash & Dash events into an existing Meet.

A case study on the integration of Splash & Dash events into an existing Meet was given by Mr Hill of UWA-West Coast whose Club successfully trialled this at their recent Short Course Challenge. This option will be introduced in the coming season on a limited basis, and if a Club is interested they should speak directly with the Development Officer, Tiffany Ferguson-Blight, regarding their particular Meet and requirements.

#### Heatleys Multi Class Come and Try:

This event will run predominantly the same as previous years, fostering a relaxed and welcoming environment for new Multi Class swimmers to enter the sport. The notable change is the addition of a naming rights sponsor in 2019/20. Clubs wishing to be represented at the event should speak directly with the Development Officer, Tiffany Ferguson-Blight.

#### Westpac Summer League:

The Westpac Summer League has undergone a significant number of changes ahead of the 2019/20 season. In 2020 there will be four rounds held in each of the three Zone leagues. Clubs participating at this time include:

- Newman Churchlands Swimming Club (North)
- Breakers WA Swim Club (North)
- Tuart Hill Swimming Club (North)
- Rockingham Swimming Club (South)
- Thornlie and Districts Swimming Club (South)
- Riverside Swimming Club (South)

In addition, the Central Zone will be hosting a Westpac Central Zone Summer League, with five Clubs implementing some amended rules as approved by Swimming WA.

Significant changes for the 2020 Westpac Summer League include:

- Launch Party on 6 December 2019 at Yagan Square
- Special celebrity appearances
- Merchandise
- Dolphin Timing Assistant
- Events Officer for event day support
- Other hired entertainment (eg. giant board games, balloon twisters, etc.)
- Official times
- Giveaways

Pricing for entries will be \$20 flat rate for SWA Members, and \$25 for public in "Bring a Friend" rounds. Each entrant is entitled to up to four individual swims and two relays. SWA will retain \$5.00 of each entry as an administration fee.

6.4	<u>Development Course Calendar</u> Swimming WA has received a number of enquiries about courses being run by the Development Department, including Technical Official Courses and Coaching Courses. These dates are now all available on the calendar on the Swimming WA website's homepage. Interested parties should treat this as a first point of call for these enquiries.	
6.5	Westpac Volunteer of the Month The Westpac Volunteer of the Month will recommence in October. Clubs are requested to include this as a standing Agenda item at their Committee meetings.	
6.6	AGM and Presidents' Forum The Swimming WA AGM will take place on 12 October 2019 at AIM WA in Floreat. The next Presidents' Forum will precede this in the morning, and the Technical Officials Forum will follow it in the afternoon.
