The last 12 months have been outstanding for the sport of swimming in Western Australia. We've brought on board new sponsors, secured two national events as well as a brand new international event, welcomed a new patron and seen our athletes reach great heights in the sport.

As an organization, we have continued to move from strength to strength, developing a new strategic plan for 2010-2015 and delivering against our core values of life, community and performance.

Our current position is thanks, in large part, to our sponsors both old and new. In September 2010 we welcomed on board Toyota WA and the Sunday Times as major sponsors of Swimming WA. Both the teams at Toyota WA and the Sunday Times have been fantastic since joining us, and I look forward to what will no doubt be long and successful partnerships. We are also entering into the twentieth year of partnership between Swimming WA and the Hancock Family Medical Foundation, a fantastic milestone for our organizations. Hancock, along with all of our sponsors, continues to deliver outstanding support to help grow and strengthen our sport.

In 2010 Swimming WA was approached by the State Government of WA with an opportunity to develop and secure a brand new international aquatics event. The BHP Billiton Aquatic Super Series, to be held in WA in 2013, will combine elite swimming, water polo, open water and community in a unique and exciting aquatics event – the biggest in Australia. As a founding partner, Swimming WA will play a significant role in the delivery of this event over its first three years and will look to continue this role as the event establishes itself as a permanent international sporting event in Western Australia.

Earlier this year we welcomed Western Australia's Minister for Mines and Petroleum, Fisheries and Electoral Affairs the Honourable Norman Moore MLC as the new patron of Swimming WA. Norman is one of the most well respected members of the West Australian Government, and to be able to welcome him as a part of our organisation is a real honour.

The strength of our organization has also been reflected in the performance of our sport, particularly over the last 12 months. The individual performances of our swimmers at this year's Australian Swimming Championships secured six berths on the Australian Swim team ahead of the Shanghai World Championships in July. Western Australia now has an 11% representation on the Australian Team – punching well above our weight. This is evidence of not only the strength of our swimmers, but the pathways that are in place developing our athletes from club swimming through to international competition.

The board strategically appointed a performance and development coach on a 2 year term ensuring the engagement of regional and grassroots coaching and performance coaching.

Over the last 12 months Swimming WA has engaged with stakeholders, officials, coaches, and members to deliver a range of programs and initiatives across the state. We have worked closely with schools, engaging 11,500 school swimmers, reestablishing the Schools and Colleges Relays and creating a new schools swimming pathway.

# INFRASTRUCTURE

# Development of an Aquatic Strategic Facility Plan

# Brief

In order to ensure WA's Aquatic facilities will meet the demands of the sport in the future, Swimming WA identified the need to develop a strategic facilities plan.

# Outcomes

Swimming WA engaged, within a working group, WA's aquatic sports, stakeholders and the State Government to develop the Aquatic Strategic Facility Plan. The plan will consider the facility requirements for the sport of swimming state wide, from local facilities through to our elite venues.

In addition to the Aquatic Strategic Facility Plan, Swimming WA has also engaged with VenuesWest in a review of the State's premier aquatic facilities, namely Challenge Stadium and the need to implement a strategy that will ensure WA has the necessary infrastructure to make competitive bids for National and International swimming events in the future. This process is currently in the stages of creating a business case to be presented to the West Australian Government for consideration.

Both of these initiatives are expected to produce outcomes within the next 12 months.

# Secured significant upgrades to Challenge Stadium

# Brief

As part of Swimming WA's successful bid to host the 2012 Australian Short Course Championships, significant upgrades needed to be made to the pool facilities at Challenge Stadium.



# Outcomes

Following the announcement that Perth will host the 2012 Australian Short Course Championships at Challenge Stadium, VenuesWest has committed to and commenced work on significant upgrades to the pool facilities at the venue. The upgrades will include new timing equipment, a video board and diving blocks amongst a range of other improvements. The upgrades will benefit the entire sport in WA, with the permanent changes bringing the facility up to a National standard.

# Swimming WA Office Refurbishment

# Brief

As Swimming WA's profile, staff and stakeholder engagement has grown over the past 12 months, so too has the need for a more professional and presentable office environment.

# Outcomes

Swimming WA engaged a graphic design and signage company to design and install new signage as well as window decals through the Swimming WA offices. The offices also received a new coat of paint, furniture and layout restructuring, creating a more professional and functional office environment for Swimming WA's expanding operations.

# Creating a consistent brand for Swimming WA

# Brief

# Outcomes

Swimming WA has engaged a design company to design and implement new branding across all collateral, websites, signage and promotional material, creating an identifiable brand for the sport.

Collateral for programs including Dive and Try, Swimmer of the Year Awards and sponsorship documents have all been aligned with the new branding along with the new SWA office refurbishment, websites and signage.



# Membership

# Brief

Over the 2010/2011 season there has been a small increase in Competitive members with Swimming WA, but also a decrease in Recreational members. During 2010/2011 Swimming WA had 85 affiliated clubs across the Metropolitan and Regional areas.

# **Outcomes**

Now in the 2011/2012 season Swimming WA has already seen 2 new clubs become affiliated while working on more clubs becoming affiliated during the summer season. The introduction of some new clubs, along with Swimming WA and Swimming Australia recruitment and retention programs in place, Swimming WA is eager to increase membership during the 2011/2012 season by at least 10%.

# Dive and Try Swim Meets, presented by SunSmart

# Brief

The Dive and Try swim meets for 2010/2011 were extremely beneficial for the clubs involved. 2010/2011 saw an increase in the amount of clubs hosting a Dive and Try meet, the total amount of participants at the meets and the number of new members who joined clubs as a direct result of a Dive and Try swim meet.

The Dive and Try swim meets are a useful recruitment tool for clubs and give clubs the opportunity to promote the sport of swimming to those who may not have considered the sport previously.

# Outcomes

As the primary goal of these meets is to recruit new members to swimming clubs we have made it more accessible for clubs to host and run a Dive and Try Swim Meet. This has been done by not restricting the amount of meets that clubs can run and through Swimming WA no longer requiring a portion of the entry fees. This has already shown to work with 30 clubs already locked in to host a SunSmart Dive and Try swim meet in the 2011/2012 season.

# SunSmart Schools and Colleges Relays

# Brief

2011 saw the return of the Schools and Colleges Relays with 30 schools and more than 2000 students competing. Christ Church Grammar School took out the Pop Agnew trophy (Boys 6x50m Freestyle Relay) and the Champion Boys School Cup and Iona Presentation College took out the McClements/Watson Trophy (Girls 6x50m Freestyle Relay) and the Champion Girls School Cup.

# Outcomes

After a successful return to the pool in 2011, along with some slight changes to allow more swimmers the opportunity to swim, Swimming WA is confident the event will continue to grow. Some great feedback has been provided by the schools that attended in 2011 and will look to return once again for 2012.

# **School Swimming**

# Brief

Swimming WA has had only a small involvement with School Swimming over recent years. 2010/2011 saw a more targeted focus to helping and assisting schools and school associations with running schools swimming carnivals and keeping schools involved in the sport of swimming.

Between October 2010 and April 2011 Swimming WA attended 24 school and association swimming carnivals, interacting and engaging with 206 schools and 11,674 swimmers. Swimming WA also had 94 technical officials attend various carnivals and they were greatly appreciated by the schools.

# Outcomes

Attending these school and association swimming carnivals has highlighted the huge market of school swimming and areas where Swimming WA can further engage our clubs to create links between clubs and schools, giving clubs direct access to their target membership market.

Swimming WA will continue to work closely with schools, offering assistance where possible, technical officials for carnivals and various other tasks. A more defined School Swimming Pathway and School to Club link to assist clubs in creating further links with local schools is being developed for roll out in 2011-2012.

# **Multi Class Swimming**

# Brief

Multi Class swimming has seen a greater from the association, with Swimming Australia (SAL) driving a number of new initiatives in this area including the release of the SAL Classification Policies and Procedures in May 2011 and the introduction of SAL Classification Card for swimmers with disability. 43 swimmers from WA have the new classification card.

The establishment of the Swimmers with Disability Advisory group in 2010 will ensure that the Multi Class section of swimming continues to grow in future years.

A Disability Sport and Recreation Audit was completed with the Department of Sport and Recreation. Swimming WA was seen to be taking a positive approach to inclusion and was praised for actively pursuing relationships with other disability service providers through the Inclusion WA network.

Swimming WA continues to work closely with the APC and SAL on the training of new classifiers and improving the area of Multi Class Swimming in WA.



# Learn to Swim

# Brief

SWA provides a learn to swim program at the Chisholm Catholic College pool, that caters for children aged 3 years and over through to adults. The program commenced in October 2008, and is part of a longterm agreement with the school.



# Outcomes

The learn to swim program has shown remarkable growth in the past 12 months during each of the term based programs, particularly in 2011. The overall figures however are only slightly ahead of budget targets with only 1 holiday program being held out of 4 budgeted. The learn to swim program has shown a significant increase in enrolments compared to the figures from the same time last year.

# **GO Club**

# Brief

Swimming Australia's GO Club PB is the national swimming club standard that recognises and rewards swimming clubs by measuring their performance across five key areas: Memberships, Administration, Activities, Coaching and officiating, Marketing and promotion.


For the 2011 GO Club PB program 48 Clubs completed the workbook and received a standard.

# Outcomes

The GO Club PB Program is not only useful for our clubs but also assists Swimming WA to work with clubs on areas that appear as weaknesses, and utilise clubs who are working well in these areas to also assist others. Over the last two years the amount of clubs involved in the program has increased significantly with 50% of Swimming WA Affiliated clubs participating. Swimming WA aims to have all affiliated clubs involved in this program next season.

# Outcomes



# Outcomes

Ongoing improvements to event planning and operational procedures, combined with the presence of Swimming WA staff at major events have resulted in an overall improvement in the standard at which competitions are delivered.

The 2010-11 Water Corporation Open Water Swim Series once again captured the imagination of both competitive and non swimming members alike, across all Open Water Swim distances. In complimenting excellent participation in this relatively new swimming initiative, Swimming WA made significant infrastructure investments in areas such as electronic timing equipment, online entry capability and a dedicated event website.

Open Water Swimming is perfectly aligned with the associations strategic goals and through good governance and management, this series of events and the broader sport of swimming in Western Australia will continue to thrive for years to come.

# **Corporate Events**

# Brief

Swimming WA hosted four key corporate events in 2010/11; the 2011 Vorgee WA Swimmer of the Year Awards, Off the Blocks Luncheon, 2011 State Championships Pool Side VIP Function and the Boardroom Lunch.

# Outcomes

The 2011 Vorgee Swimmer of the Year Awards was held at the Burswood Convention Centre on Saturday 18th June 2011. This year's event was attended by 270 guests, with representatives from 19 metro and 6 regional clubs. The event also attracted a strong attendance from Swimming WA's key stakeholders including sponsors, government officials and corporate guests. The event was live streamed to more than 300 households and received strong coverage from local and state media.

# **Delivering National events**

# **Brief**

In line with our strategic goals, Swimming WA has developed and implemented a rigorous event tendering process to ensure Western Australia continues to make competitive bids for both National and International swimming events.

# Outcomes

In 2011 Swimming WA successfully secured two National Events, the 2012 Australian Open Water Championships and the 2012 Australian Short Course Championships, and a brand new and unique international event, the BHP Billiton Aquatic Super Series.

# 2012 Australian Open Water Championships

Western Australia will host the 2012 Australian Open Water Championships in the lead up to the London Olympic Games following a successful bid for the event by Swimming WA.

The Champion Lakes Regatta Centre in Armadale, Perth will host the championship event in February (17-19), which will see Australia's top open water swimmers from 116 clubs competing in the elite competition.

# 2012 Australian Short Course Championships

Western Australia has secured the 2012 Australian Short Course Championships - the first national event following the London Olympic Games and selection event to the World Short Course Championships.

The announcement was made by Swimming Australia as part of the 2012-2013 national swimming calendar of events.

This is a great result for the WA swimming community and testament to the strength of the sport in Western Australia.

### **BHP Billiton Aquatic Super Series**

West Australians will get the opportunity to take part in a brand new and unique international aquatic event when the BHP Billiton Aquatic Super Series takes off in WA in 2013.

# **EVENTS**


Over the last 12 months Swimming WA has invested a great deal of effort in developing and securing this exciting opportunity for our sport, which will engage the whole of the state across its multiple elements.

The brand new event, of which Swimming WA is a founding partner, will combine a unique festival of elite and mass participation aquatic sport, headlined by the Australian Swim Team taking on the might of China and South Africa.

A world-class program of pool events will be held at Challenge Stadium in Perth, complemented by two international water polo matches and a series of elite and mass participation open-water races, delivering Perth and Western Australia with a unique and iconic international aquatic event.

The Super Series will also see past and present athletes embark on a regional program that will engage communities throughout regional and metropolitan Western Australia with the event and its sports.


The BHP Billiton Aquatic Super Series will be staged from the 14 to 21 January 2013.

# Brief

The Swimming WA High Performance Pathway was developed in July 2010 with over 180 athletes selected, based on their performances during the 2009/10 long course season. The program was designed to give athletes and coaches the opportunity to advance through the pathway by providing educational activities to enhance athlete performance. Sessions were held twice a month at Challenge Stadium with athletes and their coaches attending under the guidance of Greg Hodge, WAIS Swimming Performance Manager.

Travel Assistance Grants (TAG) were provided to WA athletes based on the principle that competitive athletes travelling interstate from Western Australia incur disproportionate travel and accommodation costs compared to interstate athletes when competing interstate. It is recognised that an assisted relief in offsetting some of these costs is in the best interest of Swimming WA for the pursuit of national representation. Over 50 athletes received TAG for National Competitions during 2010/11.

Athletes from WA enjoyed strong success at National competitions throughout 2010/11, winning 47 medals. As a result of their performances at the 2011 Telstra National Championships 6 athletes from WA were selected for the 2011 World Championship Team.

# Junior Excellence Program (JX) and Youth Performance Squad (YPS)

# Brief

The JX program recognises swimmers aged 9-13 in a tiered standard of green, bronze, silver, gold and gold star depending on times achieved during the season at certain meets. The YPS program is an extension to the JX program and is targeted to 13-18 year olds. In 2010/2011 Swimming WA recognised 210 swimmers for their efforts.

# Outcomes

In 2010/2011 Swimming WA had 1268 swimmers achieve a JX standard with each swimmer receiving a pack for their efforts. There has been a constant increase in swimmers being recognised in this program from WA each year. The standards have given swimmers something to work towards and achieve, and the program overall has been widely regarded as a strong success.

# Coach Engagement (SWA Members & Accredited Coaches)

# **Brief**

In order to better communicate with and assist WA's outstanding coaching group, Swimming WA recognised the need to develop a coaching member database, and encourage WA's coaches to join as Swimming WA members.



# **SWA Members & Accredited Coaches**

# Outcomes

**Head Coaches:** There were a total of 86 clubs across the state, with 73 of those formally recognising a Head Coach. In July of 2010, 49 of those coaches were accredited however as courses became more widely advertised through the Performance & Development Coach, and as confidence grew within the coaching community, that number increased by 13% to 59 by the close of the 2010/11 financial year.

**SWA Coach Membership:** A coaching analysis revealed that approximately 290 coaches were operating within the club structure. Of those 290 there were 175 that were ASCTA accredited with 120 of those being members of Swimming WA.

By June 2011 Swimming WA Coach Membership had increased by more than 28% with 201 coaches now being members of Swimming WA and fully accredited under ASCTA.

# **Education Forums**

# **Brief**

Swimming WA conducts a range of education clinics to both Metropolitan and Regional Clubs. The clinics are designed to address education gaps by incorporating pool sessions, presentations, educational lectures, joint meetings and other open forums that ultimately provide a physical link to the state's governing body and open the communication channels between all members of the region.

# PERFORMANCE

# **Metropolitan Clinics**

The 10 Metropolitan Clinics held in 2010-2011 covered a wide variety of topics engaging 137 coaches and ensuring all aspects of the SWA Performance Pathway had been covered.

Presentations by the National Youth Head Coach and WAIS Swimming Performance Manager focused on high performance, while the more hands on sessions by the Performance & Development Coach catered for the development level coaches.

# **Regional Clinics**

The 10 Regional clinics held in 2010-2011 were a strong success with 555 swimmers, 95 coaches and 53 clubs participating in the two day clinics.

The clinics focussed on the basic skills of starts, turns, finishes and technique across all four strokes. The clinics saw a notable improvement in the number of disqualifications at Country Pennants and Country Champs as well as a significant increase in the number of participants at country based meets.

# **Coaches Conference**

Once again Swimming WA hosted the annual Coaches Conference, engaging with coaches right across the state. The 2010 SunSmart Coaches Conference took place on the 13th and 14th of November to strong reviews. Some key attendees were ASCTA National President Ross Gage, keynote speaker and Head Coach of the AIS John Fowlie, mentor coach for SWA Bernie Mulroy and Swimming Performance Manager from WAIS Greg Hodge. There were close to 60 coaches in attendance over the two days which was a positive result.

# Mentor Coach Program

# Brief

Swimming WA has established a sustainable mentor coach program available to all coaches throughout the state that helps identify suitable mentor coaches to assist in the delivery of key messages, both for the association and the sport.

# Outcomes

Of the head coaches across the state, 61% have a specific mentor coach in place, with an additional 25% indicating that they network with their fellow coaches in place of having a designated mentor. The Performance & Development Coach has been approached by 6 coaches to become their mentor producing strong results.

Specific coaches have been researched and targeted to become 'regionally based' mentor coaches. Attributes including the coach's ability to communicate and their level of engagement during educational activities throughout the year played a large part in their selection. These coaches have been provided additional educational opportunities to ensure the quality of information passed on is done so to the highest standards expected of our organisation.

# **Program Visits**

# **Brief**

Swimming WA's program visits are designed to engage with the head coaches of each club on yearly basis, to assist in the delivery of coaching support from SWA.

# **Metropolitan Program Visits**

Observations were recorded on the basic skill level of our swimmers, along with important data that will be used to implement more specific educational opportunities, addressing any gaps found within the metropolitan programs.

# **Regional Program Visits**

16 regional visits took place throughout the 2010-2011 season which doubled the overall target. This was due to a combination of the Performance & Development Coach's successful involvement with 10 regional clinics and attendance to 6 regional swim meets across the state.

Face to face contact was made with more than 2000 swimmers and over 200 coaches throughout the 16 regional visits. This significant improvement in contact between Swimming WA staff and the members of our regional areas was rewarded at the 2011 SWA Country Championships which recorded the highest individual athlete attendance in more than a decade.

# **Partnerships**

# Brief

Swimming WA has been actively creating partnerships with education and accreditation providers, to ensure the continuity of messages across stakeholder organisations including SWA, SAL, ASCTA National, asctaWA and WAIS.

# **Outcomes**

Relations between Swimming WA and the major coach related stakeholders is stronger than ever, following an busy year of proactive engagement by the Performance & Development Coach.

Attendance at regular asctaWA board meetings, coaching clinics and other coach educational sessions has seen confidence grow, not only within the parties located within our own state but within the wider coaching community across the country.

This confidence has led to Swim Australia joining forces with SWA and asctaWA, in the joint coordination of the 2011 SwimWEST Conference, which for the first time ever, will see the education of Coaches, Learn to Swim Teachers/Pool Operators and Officials all under the same roof.

Strong communication with national bodies Swimming Australia and ASCTA have seen the Performance & Development Coach become a coaching stream coordinator for the 2011 ASCTA Convention and a member of Swimming Australia's Coach Accreditation Review Management Advisory Committee (CARMAC), which is currently reviewing the coach education system.

AsctaWA, and the coaches they represent, were proactively engaged in the planning of the 2011/12 summer calendar, a thorough process that was reported to be a first for the state.


# **Official Scholarships**

# Brief

Swimming WA, along with the Technical Committee, have identified the need to further encourage members to become technical officials within the sport, through the promotion of a scholarship program.

# Outcome

The Swimming WA Officiating Scholarship will provide parents and ex swimmers the opportunity to continue their involvement in swimming in a different capacity by providing travel assistance, education and access to courses. The scholarship program is expected to be implemented in 2011/2012 and aims to produce more officials with the ability to officiate at a state level.



# **GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT**

# Development of a Strategic Plan for 2010-2015

# Brief

The Board of Swimming WA tasked the organisation with the responsibility of developing a new strategic plan that identified the key objectives to which the organisation would be guided by for the next 5 years.

# Outcomes

The 2010-2015 Strategic Plan was finalised and printed at the end of 2010, and guides all Swimming WA operations. The Strategic Plan identified seven key areas of operations: Infrastructure, Profile, Community Participation, Sustainability, Events, Performance and Governance and Management.

An Operational Plan was developed to compliment the Strategic Plan, and ensure that all staff operations are aligned to the seven areas of focus for the association over the next five years.

# Building partnerships in sport

# Brief

As part of the development of the 2010-2015 Strategic Plan, Swimming WA developed the vision:

" To be the Premier Aquatic Sporting Body in Western Australia"

# Outcomes

With this vision as our goal, Swimming WA has begun to develop stronger partnerships with WA's aquatic sports. In 2010-2011, Swimming WA formed a formal partnership with Synchro WA which will see resources shared between the two organisations, as well as greater collaboration in the areas of development, infrastructure and profile.

Swimming WA has also delivered joint initiatives with Masters Swimming WA, specifically in the area of Open Water, and developed stronger working ties with Water Polo WA. Water Polo WA and Swimming WA are both stake holders in the BHP Billiton Aquatic Super Series.

I am sure that some of the Alcoa people now know the ins and outs of a swimming carnival.

The feedback from the swimmers was all positive with many of them making PB's and achieving their qualifying times for States and Country Championships. The timing and recording of our swimmers times was made easier by the attendance of Blue Woods and his timing equipment. I would like to extend to Blue and Sandra a big "Thank You" from the region in their continued support for all our Clubs throughout the whole of Region One.

As we had in attendance all our coaches, swimmers, parents and club members it was a great time to acknowledge our Development Squad.

The two affiliated swimming clubs in the region are Broome Barracudas Swimming Club and Derby Sharks Swimming Club. Both clubs train all year round, however membership tends to peak in term 1 when Broome has around 100 active members and Derby 60. Derby has struggled this year to attract committee members and coaches resulting in difficulties for the club and a lack of attendance at competitions. However a couple of new faces have stepped in and an AGM is due to be held in Derby soon. Broome has had another busy year with membership continuing to expand where possible over six training squads. The main barrier to club expansion for Broome is lack of lane space, which is only going to get more difficult as the town grows.

The following development activities have been held in Broome this year:

- 18th / 19th June Clinic with CJ from West Coast
- 30 Sept / 1st Oct Clinic with Kareena Preston from South Shore
- 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> October Kimberley Open Short Course Championships which attracted over 100 entries from 16 clubs mainly from Perth, ensuring a high level of competition for our swimmers
- 13th November Broome Club Championships
- 16th /17th April Clinic with Terry Lalor, Performance and Development Coach Swimming WA
- 25/26 June Kimberley Region Time Trials and Officials training with Kaye Bolger

Swimmers from the region travelled to the following competitions:

- Pilbara Championships in Port Hedland (Broome won overall and handicap trophies)
- LC State Age Championships, LC Junior Championships, SC Age Championships in Perth
- Country Championships in Perth
- NT Open and Age Championships in Darwin
- North West Open in Karratha
- The Arafura Games in Darwin

However due to cost and distance the majority of Broome swimmers are only able to compete at official meets once a year at the Kimberley Open Short Course.

### **High Performance**

Broome has a small group of high performance swimmers who train up to 8 sessions a week. For the first time in many years two of these swimmers were selected for the Regional Talent Development Squad and attended the Super Camp in Perth after the State Championships. They are extremely grateful for this opportunity. Due the isolation of the Kimberley and lack of local competition it is extremely hard to get to this level and development opportunities are much appreciated.

### Great Southern - Coordinator - Kaye Bolger

Great Southern Championships held in Katanning were well attended and very well presented by the Katanning Club.

Narrogin hosted the Region Clinic this year with Terry Lalor as the visiting coach – all swimmers and coaches who attended gained benefit and enjoyed the experience.

Overall swimmer numbers in the Region are slightly down but the number competing at Country and State Championships increased – indicating the level of commitment and coaching is improving.

# Pilbara – Coordinator - Erin Shaylor

The first event of the season was the Hancock Family Pilbara Championships. Broome joined the event and dominated the results. Hedland hosted the event.


Karratha took a team to the Country Pennants in Kambalda and competed in A grade despite having no pool to train in other than a small one at the Bay Village workers camp.

The February Tornado prior to a cyclone devastated the town pool for almost the rest of the season, only opening just in time for the North West Open swimming champs which looked very likely not to go ahead. The North West Open drew teams from all over the Pilbara and Kimberley again and offered officials some training from Swimming WA officials. The event went off well with reduced numbers due to the late notice of the event being able to go ahead. As it stands the pool still does not have lighting so Karratha club can only operate time trials in daylight hours. This is a problem for the club as pool space is at a premium.

Chris Twomey delivered the Junior and Assistant coaching course to 13 potential coaches. Four coaches have since been signed off with their Green licence by a local Bronze licence coach. We had other clinics planned but were not carried out due to the pool closure in Karratha. The region is planning coaching and officials' clinics this season. The region has only one officially signed off referee which is a grave concern. Hopefully we can draw on parent help to step up to training opportunities. The transient nature of the Pilbara is ongoing and we lose our skill base annually. The vision for the Pilbara Cities will be great if facilities are provided to allow these clubs to develop and grow.



During the past season a total of 503 state records were broken during the 2010 / 2011 season compared to the 425 for the 2009 / 2010 season.

The top 5 record breaking clubs were City of Perth (85), Applecross (75), South Shore (68), Arena (46) then Breakers with (41). There were a total of 16 clubs whose members broke records (this is up from the 15 last season).

The top 5 female record breakers were Adelaide Hart APP/STSH with (143), Brianna Throssell CPER (60), Amy Williams BRW (27), Tamsin Cook BRW (27) and Emily Kayser AST (10). There were a total of 14 local female record breakers.

The top 5 male record breakers were Tommy Sucipto SLD (34), Lennard Bremer AAA (9), Andrew Walker WSS (8) and Austin McAleese ROC, Ethan McAleese ROC, Zachary Bevan ROC (all with 6 each), and Damian Fyfe CPER with (5). There were a total of 14 local male record breakers.

# **State Statistics**

The Oldest Male Long Course record broken was Tommy Sucipto of South Lake Dolphins 18yrs 100m Breaststroke on 19th April 2011 which broke the record previously held by Peter Evans of City of Perth set on 22nd July 1980, a record that stood for 30yrs and 271 days (incidentally this was Peter's Olympic Bronze Medal Time in Moscow, Russia during the 1980 Olympic Games).

**The most improved Male Long Course record** broken was the West Coast's team of Bradley Brown, Gene Williams, Dario Pervan and Patrick Hoey 15yrs 400m Medley Relay which was reduced from time of 4:34.60 to Southside Penrhos Wesley's Bradlee Sheppard, Jayden Marciano, Thomas Siford and Mathew Sankey's time of 4:17.03 a 6.84% improvement.

The Oldest Male Short Course record broken was WA All Comers & Residential Club 13yrs 200m Medley Relay West Coast's team of Andrew Warnock, Kyle Robinson, Brandon Tay and Geordi Tsirigotis on 24th July 2010 which broke the record previously held by Aqua Attack's team of Lucas Goode, Brett Woodfroffe, Balacs Markuz and Adam King set on 31st August 1997, a record that had stood for 12yrs and 327 days.

The most improved Male Short Course record broken was the All Comers, WA All Time and Residential 12yrs 800m Freestyle which was reduced from Jack Osborne's time of 9:58.42 to Ethan McAleese's new time of 9:13.14 a 8.19% improvement.

The Oldest Female Long Course record broken was Brianna Throssell of City of Perth's 14yrs 200m Butterfly on 19th December 2010 which broke the record previously held by Megen Johnston of Gladstone, QLD set on 27th February 1987, a record which had stood for 23yrs and 295 days.

The most improved Female Long Course record broken was the WA All Time 13yrs 100m Butterfly which was reduced from Brianna Throssell's time of 1:05.03 to Maggie Emmett's new time of 1:02.53 an 4.00% improvement.

The Oldest Female Short Course record broken was Emily Kayser of All Saints's 16yrs 800m Freestyle on 24 July 2010 which broke the record previously held by Rachel Harris of Claremont Uniswim on 4th August 1995, a record which had stood for 14yrs and 355 days.

The most improved Female Short Course record broken was the WA Residential 15yrs 100m Backstroke which was reduced from Adelaide Hart's time of 1:03.11 to Adelaide Hart's own time of 1:00.56 a 4.21% improvement.

# **Country Statistics**

During the past season a total of 426 country records were broken during the 2010 / 2011 season compared to the 350 for the 2009 / 2010 season.

The top 5 record breaking clubs were Bunbury (275), Peel Aquatic (123), Kalgoorlie (10), Albany (7) followed by Geraldton (5). There were a total of 7 clubs whose members broke records.

The top 5 female record breakers were Adele Schultz BUN (40), Emma Hancox GER/BUN (27), Kate Bird BUN (18), Imogen Grice KLG (10) and Alexandra Leather PAQ (4). There were a total of 9 country members that broke country records.

The top 5 male record breakers were Ryan Evernden BUN (84), Lyndon Goldsmith BUN (83), Robert Evans PAQ (63), Brodie Hedges PAQ (22) and Jeremy Brough PAQ, Jordan Kendall BUN and Keigan Williams PAQ (all with 6 each). There were a total of 12 country members that broke country records.

The Oldest Male Long Course record broken was Jeremy Brough of Peel Aquatic's 13yrs 50m Butterfly on 12th December 2010 which broke the record previously held by Bradley Hitchcock of Bunbury set on 4th January 1985, a record that stood for 25yrs and 342 days.

The most improved Male Long Course record broken was the Country All Time and Residential 16,17,18yrs and Open 400m Medley Relay which was reduced from Broome's time of 5:13.55 to Bunbury's time of 4:20.34 an 20.44% improvement.

The Oldest Male Short Course record broken was Brodie Hedges of Peel Aquatic's in the 15yrs 50m Breaststroke set on 4th September 2010 which broke the record previously held by Luke Youard of Bunbury's on 25th July 1992, a record that had stood for 18yrs and 041 days.

The most improved Male Short Course record broken was the Country All Time and Residential 13yrs 800m Freestyle which was reduced from Benjamin Bray's time of 10:35.96 to Jordan Kendall's new time of 9:24.26 an 12.71% improvement.

The Oldest Female Long Course record broken was Emma Hancox of Bunbury's 17, 18yrs and Open 100m Breaststroke on 19th December 2010 which broke the record previously held by Toni Ciffolilli of Bunbury's set on 5th January 1995, a record which had stood for 15yrs and 348 days.

The most improved Female Long Course record broken was the Country Residential 17,18yrs & Open 50m Breaststroke which was reduced from Emma Hancox's time of 0:34.44 to Emma Hancox's own time of 0:33.46 an 2.93% improvement.

The Oldest Female Short Course record broken was Imogen Grice of Kalgoorlie 15,16, 17, 18yrs & Open 400m Individual Medley on 19th September 2010 which broke the record previously held by Toni Ciffolilli of Bunbury on 4th August 1995, a record which had stood for 15yrs and 46 days.

The most improved Female Short Course record broken was the Country All Time & Residential 8yrs 100m Backstroke which was reduced from Belinda Cole's time of 1:53.37 to Alexandra Leather's new time of 1:41.04 - a 12.20% improvement.

### **Financial Report**

### Financial Year Ended 30th June 2011 And Outlook For 2011/12

The Association is in a healthy financial position finishing the year as at 30th June 2011 with net assets of \$823,269.

The Swimming WA board in consultation with the Finance and Governance Committee made a conscious decision to establish a Business Continuity Reserve combining funds from the previous Commonwealth Games Trust, World Championship Reserve and Asset Replacement Reserve. The reserve was established equal to 75% of Operational costs.

The Association's end of year financial position was a surplus of \$20,452 after accounting for a number of strategic investments made by the association in the sports future, and reconciling of material errors from 2009/10. These investments were made due to the strong financial position of the association and are testament to the Swimming WA's Board and Executive Management's strategic positioning of the association.

### Western Australian Swimming Association (Inc) Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 30 June 2011

### 1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements if the Associations Incorporation Act (Western Australia). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (Western Australia) and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AASB 110 Events After the Reporting Period AASB 1031 Materiality

No other applicable Accounting Standards or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

### (a) Grants and Sponsorship Monies

Grants and sponsorship are recognised on an accruals basis. These sponsorships have a strong historical link with the Association.

### (b) Fixed Assets

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

### (c) Clubs in Recess

Monies held on behalf of clubs which have ceased activities - repayable upon reconstitution of club.

### (d) Income Tax

The Association, being a non-profit sporting organisation, is exempt from income tax.

### (e) Annual Leave

Provision is made in respect of the Association's liability for annual leave.

### (f) Investments

All investments are carried at cost.
