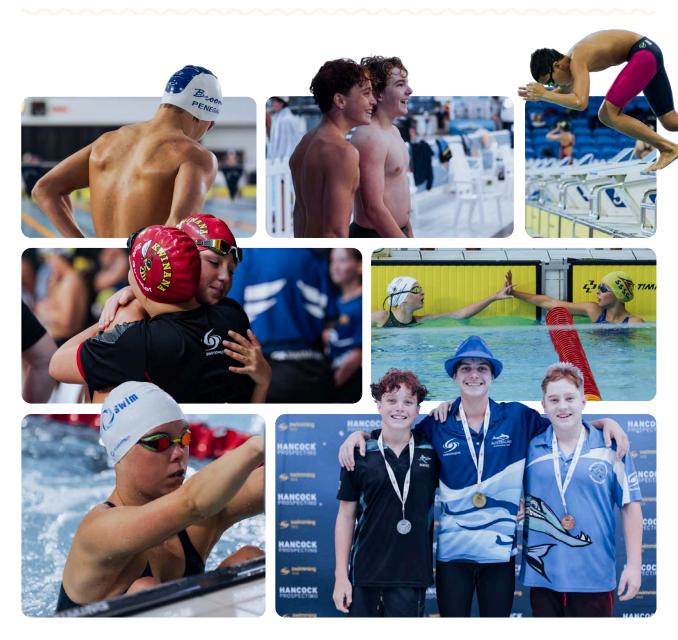

Steps for Re-Affiliation

□ **Step 1:** Crucially, please update your club information on Swim Central, including all relevant committee members. Along with submitting your Annual Information Statement to DMIRS & Income Statement to ATO.

Annual Information Statement for DMIRS -

Every incorporated association must submit an association's information statement (AIS) every year. The AIS is a short online form that asks basic questions about an incorporated association's operations to confirm that it is still active and eligible to remain incorporated.

*When an incorporated association does not submit its information statement for two or more years, we may believe it is no longer operating and take action to cancel its incorporation.

Income Statement to ATO -

Non-charitable not-for-profits (NFPs) with an active Australian business number (ABN) that self-assess as income tax exempt are required to lodge an annual NFP self-review return. For more information visit the ATO website.

- □ Step 2: Complete the Re-Affiliation application form by clicking here.
- □ **Step 3:** All committee members are required to complete the Sport Integrity Australia online course and upload certificate to Swim Central − <u>Click here to access the Safeguarding Children and Young People in Sport Induction.</u>
- □ **Step 4:** Upload the Required Club financials to Swim Central.

Required Finances:

- Profit & Loss as at 30 June 2025
- Balance Sheet as at 30 June 2025

If the club doesn't have a Profit & Loss and Balance Sheet report, please provide a Bank Statement from 01 July 2024 through to 30 June 2025.

Optional Finance Reports:

- Trade Debtors report, also known as an Account Receivables report.
- Trade Creditors report, also known as an Account Payables report.
- Step 5: Finalise payment of your affiliation invoice.
- □ Step 6: Once your affiliation is ratified by Swimming WA, a confirmation email will be sent to you.
- □ **Step 7:** Set up your club membership products in Swim Central for the new season using the SWA membership product wording in addition to your own.



Swimmer Memberships

Outlined on the following pages are the individual membership products available for the 2025/2026 season. To help compare member products, please refer to the membership matrix and the competition tiers within this section. Individual Membership is valid from 1 October 2025 to 30 September 2026. Memberships will be open for public purchase from 1 September 2025 within Swim Central. Member Clubs will be able to set up their products in Swim Central when they have completed the Re-Affiliation requirements.

Swimming WA clubs are strongly encouraged to ensure that everyone participating within the club is a registered member.

Membership provides individuals with access to the full suite of benefits offered by Swimming WA, including protection under the National Integrity Framework, comprehensive insurance when engaging in club activities, access to pathway programs such as the State Performance Pathway Program for identified swimmers, and the H2Grow Project to track growth and maturation in developing swimmers. Members can participate in the Junior Excellence program, receive support through initiatives like the Volunteer Assistance Program, and enjoy early access to SWA merchandise. Additional benefits include a subscription to our monthly e-newsletter, The Western Swimmer, exclusive access to member-only functions and educational opportunities, and rewards through the Swimming WA Rewards Programme. Being a member enhances the individual experience and strengthens the club community and the sport across Western Australia.

Accredited Coach / Foundation / Community

- Accredited Coach for Swimming Australia Accredited Coaches.
- Foundation Coach for Certified Teachers who hold current AUSTSWIM - Teacher of Towards Competitive Strokes, SCTA -Teacher of Competitive Strokes or equivalent.
- Community Coach for those who are working towards certified qualifications.

Exemption from holding a mandatory parent/guardian membership for swimmers under 18 years.

Parent/Guardian & Dry Member

Swimming Australia: \$0 Swimming WA: \$6.60

Total: \$6.60

Mandatory membership for all swimmers under 18, to have a parent/guardian membership attached.

Dry member is for supporting members of Swimming in WA eg, grandparents or Swimming Alumni.

Second Claim

\$44.00

Swimmers can only be a member of one Member Club unless approved to join a second with valid reasons, such as training disruptions or school/work commitments. Approval requires consent from both clubs and remains valid only while the justifying circumstances continue.

Accredited Technical Official / Community Official

FREE

Swimming WA for the 25/26 season will be separating official memberships into two tiers:

- Accredited Technical Official for Swimming WA Accredited Officials.
- Community Officials for those who are working towards qualifications.

Exemption from holding a parent/guardian membership for swimmers under 18 years.

Club Committee Member

FREE

Swimming WA acknowledges the volunteer parents who sit on their children's club committees. This provides an exemption for the need to obtain a mandatory parent membership, whilst a member remains on the club committee.

Club Transfer

\$27.00

Transfers that occur throughout the swimming season and between Seasons incur a cost per swimmer. Exemptions apply to parents, coaches and those under 8.







The Splash & Dash is a **FUN** event which gives participants **aged 6yrs and above** a chance to have a go at competitive swimming. There is no technical officiating, no official times, and no disqualifications.



This event offers a **safe, inclusive and welcoming environment** for new participants. Through non-traditional racing, local community members can build connections with their local clubs. Showcasing swimming as a fun & inclusive sport.
